HISTORY: We will be studying the Benin Kingdom, considering the history of another culture and how that history overlapped with the history of Britain. Learning in history will overlap with learning in other subjects.



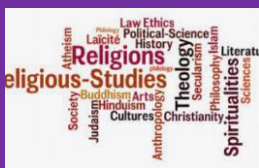
ENGLISH: This Spring Term we will be learning about a range of genres including fiction, non-fiction and poetry. We will start with a narrative fiction book called 'The Children of Benin' which will link to our history topic. We will then look at persuasive texts before exploring 'How to train your dragon' by Cressida Cowell.



PSHE / RE:

RE this term will look at the festivals of Muslims before considering what it is like to be Christian.

PSHE will consider how children keep themselves safe before looking at people's rights and responsibilities.



Science:

This Spring term science unit will centre around the 'Eco-systems' and 'Sustainability'. The class will explore the balance in the world's differing environments and how people impact those environments.



Art:

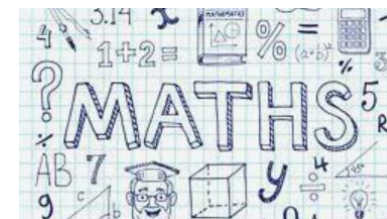
Art will explore optical illusions, and the work of Paul Cezanne. We will also explore how African Art and the Benin Bronzes affected western modern art.

Music: Music will link with other areas of the curriculum with units on African call and response and music themed around the Vikings.

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MATHS: Maths this term will continue to build on the basics of maths to ensure that all pupils have a thorough understanding to build the rest of their knowledge. This will work on multiplication and division as well as looking at more complex areas of maths such as fractions and ratios. Reasoning, fluency and problem solving will underpin all maths lessons to prepare the children for their future learning.
