Autumn Learning Overview



English

We will be doing phonics every day and will be looking at high quality texts such as *The Fox and the Star* by Coralie Pickford Smith and *Dadaji's Paintbrush* by Rashmi Sirdeshpande. In Autumn 2 we will be looking at *If all the World were by* Joseph Coelho and Alison Colpoys, followed by *A Walk in London* by Salvatore Rubbino. In addition to this we will be reading many stories in KS1 and Reception including traditional tales and well-loved tales.

Maths:

Science:

Materials: Children will learn about what objects are made of, they will investigate their properties, whether they sink or float, whether they absorb water or are waterproof and whether they are magnetic

Seasons and Weather: We will look at the weather and the changing seasons to understand what happens in our country and around the world.

Humanities - Geography

Where I live. We will be looking at the world and where we live in relation to other countries. We will look at maps and learn that we live in the United Kingdom. We will then look at our own school and its geographical features, as well as that of the surrounding area.

Humanities - History

Scientists and Engineers: The children will learn about what it means to be famous and the meaning of legacy. We will look at significant individuals and the legacy they left behind and how it has influenced life today. We will make railways, structures, bridges, investigate fossils, make our own science lab and mix 'chemicals' and look at space and black holes.

Computing:

Sorting and grouping data-The children will learn how to sort and group data. We will also be making sure we know how to be safe online.

Digital writing- The children will learn how to use the keyboard on our Chromebooks. They will write, edit and become confident in using the different tools on the toolbar.

Art: Looking at a different artist each week, exploring their work and producing our own art in the same style. For example, Bridget Riley, Charles Rennie Mackintosh and Piet Mondrian.
